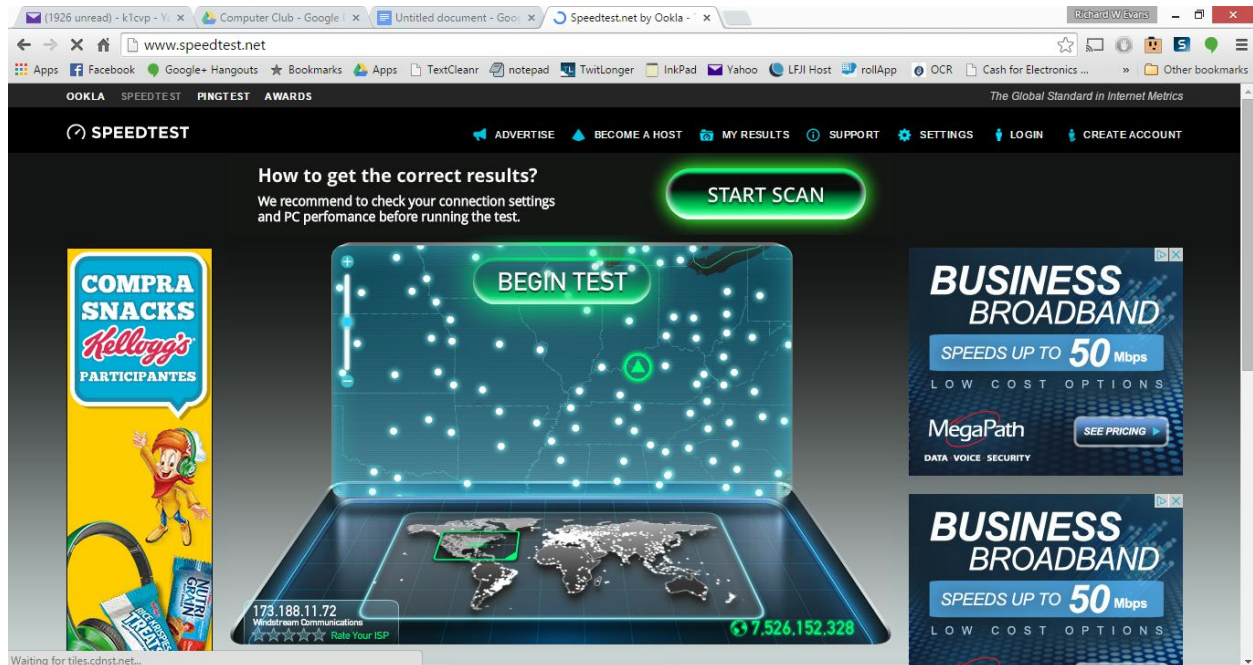


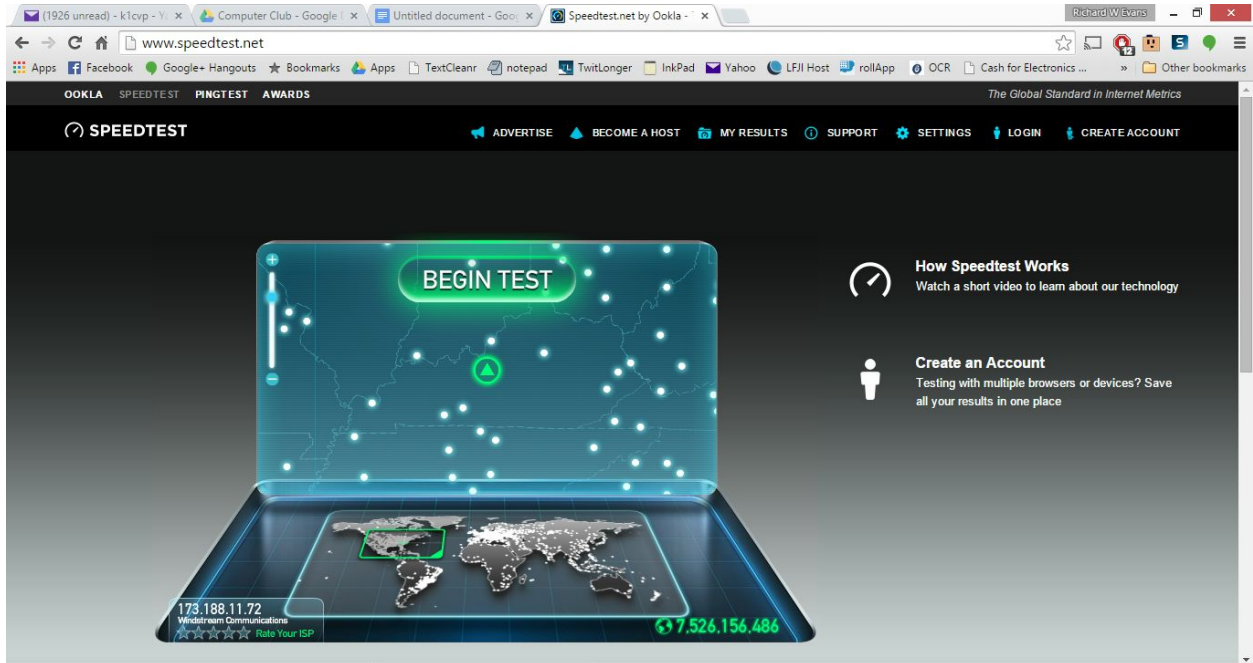
Adding AdBlock to Chrome

Adblock is an extension that can be added to Google Chrome to block most of those annoying ads that show up on a Web site. For example, if you open the Speedtest.net site a number of ads appears all over the page:



When the AdBlock extension is activated the ads go away.



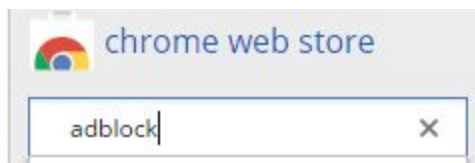
I have been using Adblock since last fall (about 10 months) and it has blocked over 100,000 ads.




To add it to your chrome browser, open chrome and copy this in the address bar: chrome://extensions/



Scroll to the bottom of the page and click Get more extensions



Type adblock and press the Enter key
