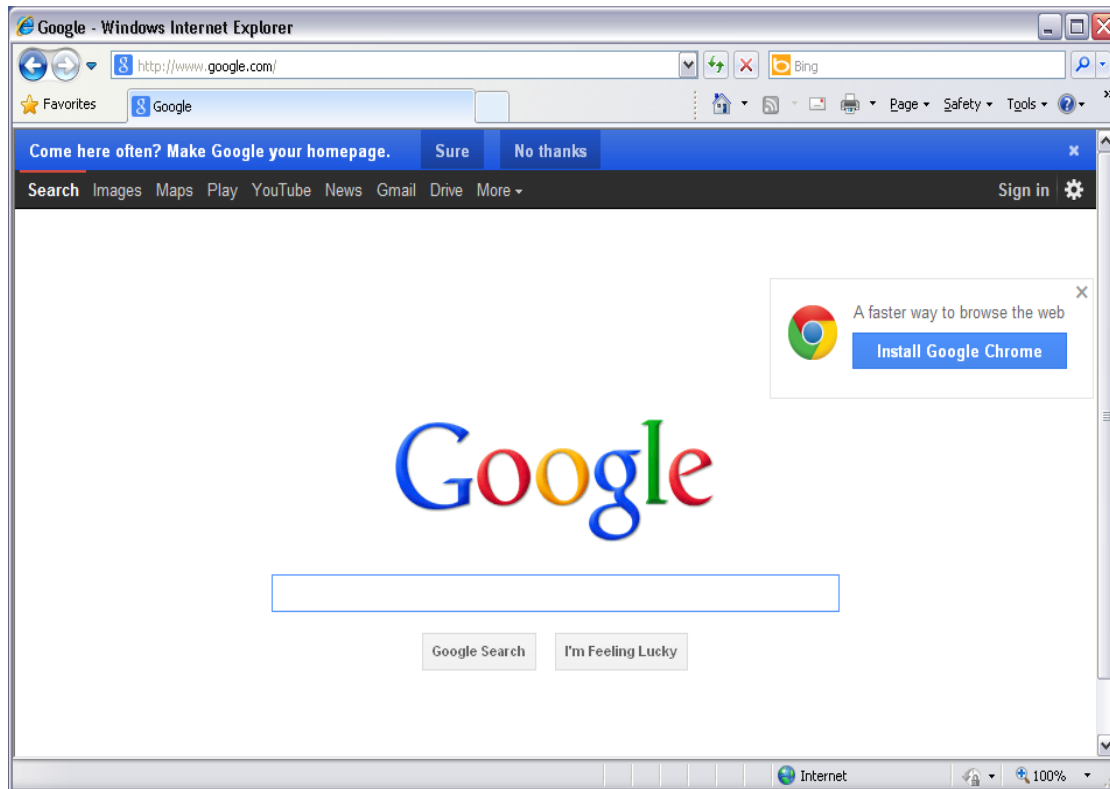
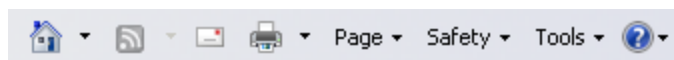


Internet Explorer Tools

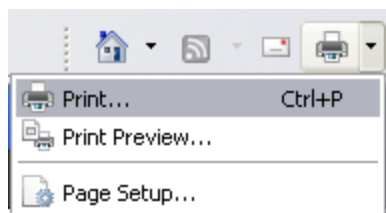


Double click the big e on the desktop to open Internet Explorer. If double clicking is hard to do, recall you can click once and press Enter on the keyboard instead.



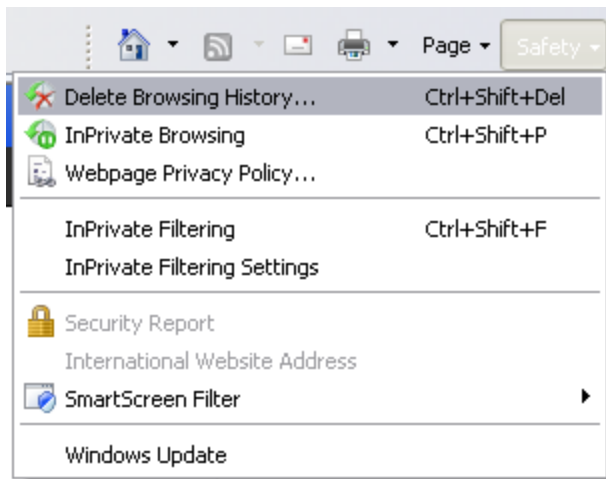
This paper discusses some of the tools on the toolbar.

The first (on the left) is a picture of a house. Click to open your homepage or the screen that opens when you first start IE (Internet Explorer). In my case this is Google.com.

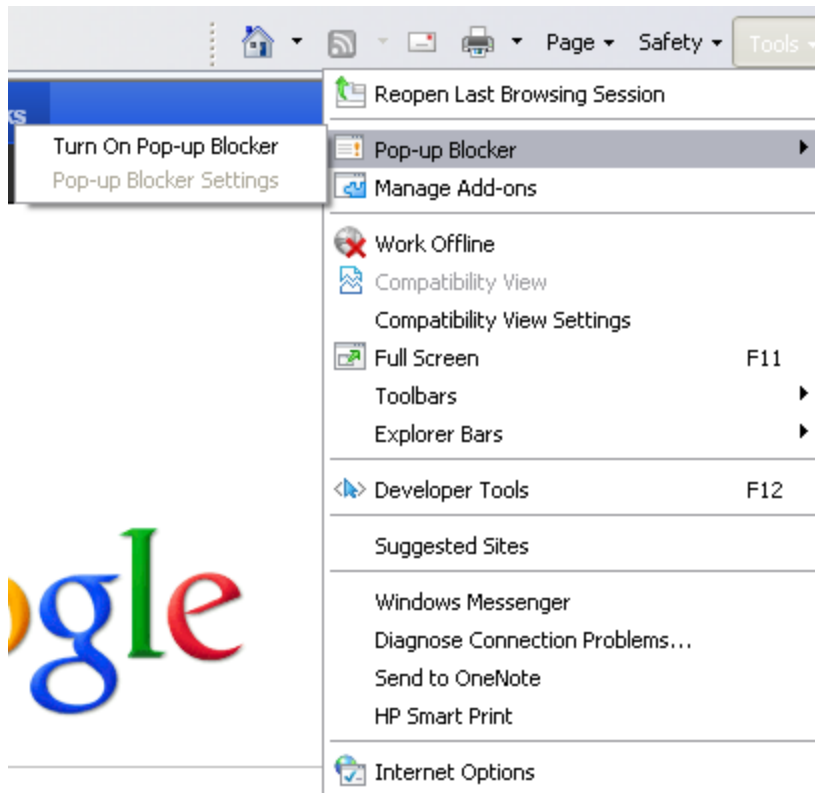


The picture of the printer will cause the page to be printed to your default printer. Pull down the arrow to the right of the printer image to select Print Preview to see what the printed pages will

look like. Notice that Ctrl+P will also cause the web page to print.



Pull down the Safety arrow to Delete Browsing History. Can also just press Ctrl+Shift+Del instead of pulling down this menu.



Use Tools to turn the Pop-up blocker on or off. Notice F11 to make the web page use the full screen. F11 again to return to showing the toolbars at the top of the screen. Also, use Internet Options to change the Homepage or add additional pages to open it tabs when you open IE.

Use Toolbars to add or remove the Menu bar or others. And Explorer Bars to open a left column to display Favorites, History, or Feeds.
